Guidelines for Ambulatory Anesthesia and Surgery

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NOTE: Secondary diagnoses might not be associated with a particular ambulatory surgery unit case. Thus, if only a first-listed diagnosis is documented, it is acceptable to report a code for just that condition. This can be for cosmetic surgery cases, especially for surgery performed on young people who typically do not have chronic conditions.

TUTORIAL How to Code an Ambulatory Surgery Record

Ambulatory typically means "the ability to walk" but in the context of surgery, it refers to patients who are able to leave the hospital the same day as the surgery, without being admitted to the hospital. Ambulatory surgery is referred to by other names, commonly called minimally invasive surgery, outpatient surgery or same-day surgery.
