## Security Guidelines For General Aviation

General Aviation (GA), as used in this document, encompasses all civil aviation, except military aviation, and scheduled or chartered passenger and cargo service under TSA security requirements in 49 CFR parts 1544 or 1546.

## Security Guidelines for General Aviation Airport Operators ...

develop and disseminate appropriate security guidelines for general aviation airports and heliports. A Working Group was established under the Aviation Security Advisory Committee (ASAC) to compile a list of recommended security best practices used throughout the industry. The ASAC delivered its recommendations to TSA in November 2003.

## Security Guidelines for General Aviation Airports

The guidelines are intended to provide U.S. general aviation (GA) airport owners, operators and users with a set of federally endorsed security enhancements and methods for implementation. "This is an important step toward ensuring the appropriate levels of security for GA airports and reflects the power of effective partnership," said Admiral Stone (USN Ret.).

## TSA releases new security guidelines for general aviation ...

The Aviation Security Advisory Committee (ASAC) Working Group on General Aviation Airport Security—an industry group assembled to assist the TSA in developing security guidelines for general aviation airports—concluded that " a flexible, common sense approach to general aviation airport security is mandatory if the industry is to retain its economic vitality and prosper. "

## Insecurity in General Aviation - The National Security Law ...

In May 2004, TSA published Information Publication A-001, Security Guidelines for General Aviation Airports ( “ Guidelines ” ). The Guidelines provide GA airport owners, sponsors and operators a set of security best practices and a method for determining when and where security enhancements would be appropriate.
