The Christian, by virtue of his or her faith, will not go through these trials alone. God is near and will walk with us through whatever valley we may find ourselves in. It is when we are face to face with the shadow of death that we must deepen our trust in God and find comfort in his presence.

This story was given to me in my mind and heart after I had a severe heart attack and was placed on life support three times. I learned the real meaning of Psalm 23 that I had read all my life.Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil. For thou are with me, thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. (Psalm 23:4) I truly believe The Sun, Thy Rod, and The Staff will change religion and spiritual development as we know it. Over the last decade, people encouraged me to write a book but I never felt that "fire" to write one. It was not until ancient pictographs became clear to me and suddenly I had an epiphany. In the very beginning ancients were the closest to originality and truth. They had achieved what modern-man has not and that is the secret to activating the full potential of the human body.Popular culture refers to these humans as Sun gods but they were just humans who followed an ancient science.
